The problem of farmers becoming stressed and abusing cows is often from over-tiredness from farming too many cows and from excess manganese, and heavy metals stressing the cows.

A survey of dairy farmers revealed that tiredness and stress were their main problems. As a farm consultant for 400 farmers I agree. If it starts with the farmer not reading enough, then solutions are not found.

Excess manganese is a cause of Parkinson's disease in people. Many who work in manganese mines get Parkinson's disease

Most New Zealand soils, pastures and vegetables are too high in manganese and unfortunately some consultants recommend fertilising with and feeding it. Organic fertilisers and vegetables are not, because they don't use superphosphate.

Heavy metals are increasing in New Zealand soils and foods because of using superphosphate.

A farmer who read my eBook in <u>www.vaughanjones.info</u> changed his mineral mix from one containing manganese to Solminix which has no heavy metals, and applied LimeMagPlus which makes heavy metals a lot less available.
